People's Light to present madcap comedy: Ken Ludwig's *Moon Over Buffalo*

July 19 – August 13, 2017 By Ken Ludwig Directed by Pete Pryor Leonard C. Haas Stage

(Malvern, PA) – Laugh until your ribs ache with Ken Ludwig's madcap comedy *Moon Over Buffalo* at People's Light. This side-splitting summer confection centers on two fading stage actors who get one last shot at stardom, if they can just keep their act together. On the brink of divorce while touring *Cyrano de Bergerac* and *Private Lives* in repertory, George and Charlotte Hay learn that Hollywood director Frank Capra is coming to their matinee, and resolve to impress him at all costs. Everything that can go wrong does go wrong in this hilarious farce directed by Pete Pryor (*Noises Off, Bach at Leipzig*), playing from July 19 through August 13 in the Leonard C. Haas Stage. Director Pryor finds a lot to relate to in this knockabout comedy. "George and Charlotte Hay, the beloved leading acting couple in *Moon Over Buffalo*, are about to enter the twilight of their season," he observes. "They're not spring chickens anymore. They've weathered the storms of life both on and offstage, and now they've arrived at a pivotal moment in their personal lives and their careers.

"I think the choices that George and Charlotte make on this journey will reverberate with, and hopefully tickle, anyone who has started a company, or followed a vocation, or pursued a passion," says Pryor. "Moon Over Buffalo is an opportunity to watch human beings behave in a ridiculously human way."

Producing Director Zak Berkman shares Pryor's enthusiasm. "Ken Ludwig's play is a terrific match for People's Light," he says. "It highlights Pete's comedic expertise, the camaraderie of our resident company, and the light-hearted, playful atmosphere of our beautiful campus in the summer."

The cast features veteran members of the Theatre's resident ensemble. David Ingram and Mary Elizabeth Scallen play the aging stars, George and Charlotte Hay. Julianna Zinkel appears as the couple's daughter Rosalind, and Christopher Patrick Mullen plays her fiancé, Howard, a local weatherman. Marcia Saunders plays Charlotte's mother Ethel. Kevin Bergen appears as Paul, the company stage manager, while Peter DeLaurier plays the company's lawyer, Richard. Frequent guest artist Tabitha Allen (*The Matchmaker, Sleeping Beauty: A Musical Panto*) plays Eileen, the troupe's ingénue.

Associate Artistic Director Pete Pryor directs. Returning guest Yoshinori Tanokura (*Stargirl, Pride and Prejudice*) designs the set. Resident artist Marla J. Jurglanis (*The Matchmaker, The Mountaintop*) creates costumes. Visiting artist John Hoey (*Jack and the Beanstalk: An American Panto, Jacques Brel is Alive & Well & Living in Paris*) designs lights, while frequent guest Christopher Colucci (*Stella and Lou, Row After Row*) designs sound. Resident artist Gina Pisasale dramaturgs the play, People's Light Resident Director Samantha Reading serves as Fight Choreographer, and long-time company member Kate Fossner stage manages.

Approximate run time of *Moon Over Buffalo* is 2 hours including a 15-minute intermission. This production will be best enjoyed by ages 13+.

Ken Ludwig *Playwright*

Ken Ludwig has had 6 shows on Broadway and 7 in London's West End, and his plays and musicals have been performed in more than 30 countries in over 20 languages. His first play on Broadway, Lend Me A Tenor, which the Washington Post called "one of the classic comedies of the 20th century," won two Tony Awards and was nominated for seven. He has also won two Laurence Olivier Awards (England's highest theater honor), the Charles MacArthur Award, two Helen Hayes Awards, the Edgar Award for Best Mystery from The Mystery Writers of America, the SETC Distinguished Career Award, and the Edwin Forrest Award for Services to the American Theatre. His plays have been commissioned by the Royal Shakespeare Company and the Bristol Old Vic. He has written 22 plays and musicals, including Crazy for You (5 years on Broadway and the West End, Tony and Olivier Award Winner for Best Musical), Moon Over Buffalo (Broadway and West End), The Adventures of Tom Sawyer (Broadway), Treasure Island (West End), Twentieth Century (Broadway), Leading Ladies, Shakespeare in Hollywood, The Game's Afoot, The Fox on the Fairway, The Three Musketeers, and The Beaux' Stratagem. His most recent plays include Baskerville, A Comedy of Tenors, and Tiny Tim's Christmas Carol (2015 Helen Hayes Award nominee for Outstanding Play). His newest book, How to Teach Your Children Shakespeare, (winner of the Falstaff Award for Best Shakespeare Book of 2014) is published by Random House. His plays have starred Alec Baldwin, Carol Burnett, Lynn Redgrave, Mickey Rooney, Hal Holbrook, Dixie Carter, Tony Shalhoub, Anne Heche, Joan Collins, and Kristin Bell. His work is published by the Yale Review, and he is a Sallie B. Goodman Fellow of the McCarter Theatre, Princeton. Now in its 42nd season, People's Light, a professional, not-for-profit theatre in Chester County, Pennsylvania, makes plays drawn from many sources to entertain, inspire, and engage our community. We extend our mission of making and experiencing theatre through arts education programs that excite curiosity about, and deepen understanding of, the world around us. These plays and programs bring people together and provide opportunities for reflection, discovery, and celebration. Founded in 1974, we produce eight to nine plays each season, in two black box theatres with 340 and 160 seats respectively, mixing world premieres, contemporary plays, and fresh approaches to classic texts. Through two new play initiatives, New Play Frontiers and The Harmony Labs, People's Light currently has nine active play commissions. Of our 418 productions, over a third (164) have been world or regional premieres.
